TOOK THE FIFTH: EX-ADMAN AND WIFE LAND \$16.5M APARTMENT

Retired advertising exec Richard “Dick” Tarlow and his wife, Kristin Kehrberg, just bought a \$16.5 million apartment at 1050 Fifth Ave., at 86th Street.

The three-bedroom, 4½-bathroom apartment was on the market for 35 days, according to StreetEasy, and sold at its asking price.

The co-op has an 80-foot stretch overlooking Central Park, and views from every room. “This apartment has everything,” the old listing notes.

That includes two terraces, “multiple seating” areas for entertaining, an open chef’s kitchen and a laundry room that can also double as a catering kitchen.

The master suite features a private terrace, two sets of baths and closet space.

White-glove building amenities include a doorman, elevator attendant, garage, gym and bike room.
