

A LOCATION CHANGE FOR SHOWTIME CHIEF

MATTHEW C. BLANK, the chief executive of Showtime, which is home to shows like “Nurse Jackie” and “Californication,” has sold his East Side apartment and is moving downtown.

Mr. Blank sold his three-bedroom apartment on Park Avenue for \$4.235 million, the original asking price. According to Streeteasy, he put the co-op on the market in January. The apartment is at 1192 Park, near 94th Street, a building designed by Rosario Candela. It was listed with Elayne Roskin, a broker at Brown Harris Stevens. Ms. Roskin declined to comment.
