ECONOMIC HEADLINES

- · All three major stock indexes posted gains last week, with the Dow closing at an all-time high on Friday.
- · Consumers are spending 11.3% of their disposable income on food, the highest percentage since 1991.
- Weekly jobless claims unexpectedly fell to 201,000.
- For the first time since the summer of 2022, the Conference Board's Leading Economic Index no longer signals a coming recession.
- Most economists polled by Reuters believe the Fed will start cutting rates in June.
- While job posts for workers without degrees are rising, it's yet to lead to increased hiring.
- Americans making student loan payments have up to 36% less saved for retirement.
- A new LendingTree report finds that increasing your credit score can help save \$92 per month.
- <u>Israel's economy contracted 19.4%</u> in the fourth quarter of 2023.
- <u>U.S. casinos won a record \$66.5 billion</u> from gamblers in 2023, a 10% increase from 2022.
- The Biden administration will forgive \$1.2 billion in student debt under the SAVE plan.
- 78% of near-retirees failed or barely passed a basic Social Security guiz.
- According to the IRS, tax evasion by millionaires and billionaires tops \$150 billion a year.

HOUSING NEWS

- Existing home sales rose 3% in January.
- Mortgage demand <u>fell sharply during the week ending February 16</u>, as rates rose above 7%.
- · According to Creditnews Research, these are the best and worst metro areas for first-time homebuyers.
- Children of homeowners are more likely to be homeowners, according to a Wharton School professor.
- · According to a new study from This Old House, homeowners is Arizona, Nevada, and Florida tend to stay the shortest amount of time in their homes before moving.

NEW YORK UPDATE

- The Supreme Court has refused to hear challenges to NYS's rent stabilization laws.
- NYC's budget surplus for the current year is \$2.8 billion more than the Mayor expected, according to the city's Independent Budget Office.
- · Mayor Adams has cancelled a plan to cut all NYC agency budgets by 5%, but will cut almost \$600 million in spending for migrants.
- Google has opened its newest NYC office at St. John's Terminal.
