ECONOMIC HEADLINES


- The Dow posted its best week since May.
- The stock market is in its <u>longest stretch without a 2% sell-off</u> since the financial crisis.
- Retail sales <u>rose less than expected</u> in May.
- Weekly jobless claims fell by 5,000 to 238,000.
- Production at U.S. factories increased more than expected in May.
- Federal Reserve officials are <u>urging patience on rate cuts</u>, as they wait for more evidence inflation is cooling.
- Office tenants are taking on average 14% less space than before the pandemic, and more than half of leases signed before 2020 have yet to come up for renewal according to JPMorgan.
