TOP STORY

ECONOMIC HEADLINES

- The Dow and S&P 500 closed the week at record highs.
- Retail sales <u>rose more than expected</u> in September.
- Initial claims for unemployment unexpectedly fell to 241,000.
- Small business owners are growing more uncertain about the economy.
- <u>Industrial production fell in September</u>, due in part to a strike at Boeing and two hurricanes.
- · Americans haven't been this worried about making their credit card payments since the pandemic.
- The WSJ's survey of 66 economists found they are increasingly optimistic about the economy's prospects.
- American consumers are increasingly underwater on their car loans.
- Holiday spending this year is expected to reach a <u>record \$979.5 billion to \$989 billion</u>, according to the National Retail Foundation.
- A new tool designed by the NY Fed, shows the <u>amount of reserves in the U.S. banking system</u> remains plentiful.
- Daron Acemoglu, Simon Johnson and James Robinson were awarded the Nobel Prize in economic sciences on Monday for <u>their work on wealth inequality between nations</u>.
- The Fed's rate cuts should provide much needed help to the commercial real estate market.

HOUSING NEWS

- Mortgage rates rose for the third straight week.
- The highest rates since August brought mortgage demand down 17%.
- More buyers are <u>using mortgage assumptions</u> to secure rates as low as 3%.
- Despite the recent surge in mortgage rates, <u>homebuilder confidence rose in October.</u>
- The difference between the average 30-year fixed mortgage rate and benchmark 10-year Treasury bond yields has been falling after years of being elevated.
- Housing starts $\underline{\text{fell slightly in September}}$.

- According to Governor Hochul, extending the 421-a deadline will give NYC about 71,000 new homes.
