ECONOMIC HEADLINES

- The consumer price index rose 0.3% last month and was 2.7% higher than a year ago.
- · Housing costs eased in November, according to the November CPI report.
- Producer prices rose more than expected last month.
- The Dow posted its seventh straight losing day on Friday, its longest losing streak since 2020.
- New unemployment claims rose to a two-month high of 242,000.
- The U.S. budget deficit for the first two months of fiscal 2025 was 64% higher than a year ago.
- Although the Federal Reserve started slashing interest rates in September, the average credit card interest rate <u>has barely budged</u>.
- Here are the top 10 U.S. cities where salaries are shrinking the fastest.
- The Fed will most likely cut rates next week, here's what that could mean to you.
- The percent of households expecting their financial situation to be better a year from now jumped to 37.6%, the highest since before the Covid pandemic.
- According to the Pew Research Center, <u>half of all employed adults</u> say they're extremely or very satisfied with their jobs.

- Mortgage refinance demand surged 27%, as interest rates declined for the third straight week.

- · According to economists at a recent NAR summit, these are the 10 hottest housing spots for 2025.

NEW YORK UPDATE

- NYC is closing 25 migrant shelters amid declining numbers.
- The NYC Comptroller's Office has released their Monthly Economic and Fiscal Outlook for December.
- New York City just secured its first new 3-star Michelin restaurant in over a decade.
- <u>It will cost more than \$800 million</u> to turn the office tower at 750 Third Ave. into 639 apartments, according to owner SL Green.
- Met's owner Steve Cohen is set to spend about \$1.6 billion on payroll in his first five years.
