ECONOMIC HEADLINES

- President Trump dropped tariffs to 10% for 90 days except for China, which now faces a 145% tariff.
- Inflation was lower than expected in March.
- Producer prices unexpectedly fell 0.4% in March.
- Stocks had one of their most volatile weeks ever.
- Weekly jobless claims ticked up 4,000, but remain at historical lows.
- China raised its tariff on U.S. imports to 125%.
- Consumer sentiment was worse than expected in April.
- The European Union approved its <u>first set of retaliatory tariffs on U.S. imports</u>, but then <u>paused them for 90 days</u>.
- JPMorgan became the first Wall Street bank to forecast a U.S. recession following Trump's tariffs.
- Wall Street economists are bracing for a recession if full tariff threats take effect.
- Oil prices have fallen to their lowest level since April 2021.
- The Supreme Court ruled that the Trump administration can go forward with the firing of 16,000 probationary federal employees.
- Small-business confidence <u>dropped for a third straight month</u> in March.
- According to Al experts, these jobs are at risk of disappearing in the next 20 years.
- Here's how 20% declines in stocks came to be known as 'bear markets.'

- Mortgage rates fell for the third week in a row.
- Don't expect mortgage rates to move lower <u>because of the ongoing trade war</u>.
- Americans have \$35 trillion in home equity, but are having problems accessing it.

New York Update

- NYC has retained the top ranking as <u>the wealthiest city in the world</u> according to the latest <u>World's</u> <u>Wealthiest Cities Report 2025</u>.
- The MTA and Trump administration have agreed to <u>allow congestion pricing to continue until at least October.</u>
- The availability rate for retail space in Manhattan fell to 14.6% in the first quarter of 2025, the lowest level since JLL started tracking it in 2017.
