ECONOMIC HEADLINES


- All three major stock averages posted gains last week.
- The Conference Board Leading Economic Index fell 0.7% in March.
- Weekly jobless claims ticked up to 222,000.
- Durable goods orders jumped 9.2% last month.
- Consumer sentiment fell to 52.2 in April, from 57 in March.
- President Trump said he plans to be "very nice" to China in any trade talks and that <u>tariffs will drop</u> if the two countries can reach a deal.
- Investors are growing wary of U.S. assets as President Trump keeps attacking Fed Chair Powell.
- According to a new analysis, tariffs levied by President Trump <u>would hurt the poorest U.S. households more</u> than the rich
- · According to a new Fed report, businesses are already trying to pass tariff costs onto customers.
- Consumer spending was up big in early April according to JPMorgan, as people bought in anticipation of tariffs.
- The IMF expects a 'significant slowdown' in economic growth this year due to tariffs and economic uncertainty.
- President Trump said 'there is a chance' that tariff revenue could <u>replace the federal income tax</u>.
- 85% of Americans have concerns about tariffs according to a new NerdWallet survey.
- Americans expect they will <u>need \$1.26 million to retire comfortably</u>, according to a recent study by Northwestern Mutual.
- The International Monetary Fund forecasts U.S. tariffs will help lower the country's fiscal deficit slightly in 2025.
- CRE market sentiment <u>dropped by most in Q1 since pandemic</u>.
- Foreign visitors to the United States by air fell nearly 10% in March from the same month a year earlier.
- The 19 richest U.S. households saw a \$1 trillion wealth increase in 2024.
- Americans are more worried about <u>running out of money in retirement</u> than dying.

HOUSING NEWS

- Mortgage applications fell 12.7% in the week ending April 18.
- The average 30-year conforming mortgage rate ticked down to 6.81% last week.
- Existing home sales declined 5.9% in March.
- Sales of new homes <u>rose more than expected</u> in March.
- Realtor.com has released their Report Card for Homebuilding and Affordability.
- Senior housing has become so scarce many older adults are buying before they need it.

NEW YORK UPDATE

- Employment in NYC hit a record high in March according to the Economic Development Corporation.
- President Trump warned NY of "serious consequences" if it doesn't end congestion pricing.
- NYC's most expensive home is listed for \$110 million amid market uncertainty.
- Mayor Adams' neighborhood-reshaping rezonings could permit 40,000 homes in 2025.
- NYC's reforms to private trash pickup have been delayed until the end of 2027.
