JOB GROWTH WEAKER THAN EXPECTED IN AUGUST

- Payrolls rose by just 22,000 last month, much lower than the 75,000 forecast.
- According to ADP, private-sector hiring rose by 54,000 in August.
- The number of job openings fell by 176,000 to 7.181 million in July.
- Jobless claims rose more than expected in the week ending August 30.

- The S&P 500 and Nasdag were up last week, while the Dow was slightly lower.
