### City Payrolls Rise 2%

- Employment in New York City increased by 85,400 from May 2015 to May 2016, a 2% gain.
- Education and health services (+30,400) and professional and business services (19,400) added the most jobs over the past year.
- Trade, transportation, and utilities was the only sector to lose jobs compared to May 2015, as retail employment fell by 6,200.

#### NYC Building Permits Plunge from 2015's Inflated Levels

- Through the first four months of the year, permits have been filed for 2,932 new residential units in New York City.
- This figure is 75% lower than the same period in 2015.
- Last year, developers were rushing to get permits filed before the expiration of the 421a program, leading to the highest permit figures since 1962.

### 30-Year Mortgage Rates Hit Three-Year Low

- Rates for 30-year mortgages averaged 3.54% in the week ending June 16th, their lowest level since May 2013.
- A year ago rates were averaging 4.00%.
- Global economic concerns and the expectation the Federal Reserve would put off a rate hike, brought mortgage rates down 12 basis points in the past two weeks.


