Manhattan Weekly Contract Signed

JOB GROWTH STRONGER THAN EXPECTED IN AUGUST

- Payrolls rose by 187,000 last month, beating the 170,000 estimate.
- The unemployment rate rose to 3.8%, its highest level since February 2022.
- Here's a chart of job growth in August by industry.
- The number of job openings fell to its lowest level since March 2021, but there are still 8.8 million unfilled jobs in the U.S.
- Initial claims for unemployment fell to 228,000 in the week ending August 26.

ECONOMIC HEADLINES

- All three major stock indexes were up last week, with the S&P 500 posting its best week since June.
- Manufacturing activity contracted for the 10th straight month in August.
- The Fed's preferred measure of inflation ticked higher in July.
- Rising gas prices has consumers less confident about the economy.
- The U.S. trade deficit fell sharply in June.
- Economic growth in 2Q23 was revised lower.
- China and the U.S. are working to ease trade tensions.
- Regulators are forcing regional banks to raise debt levels.
- <u>61% of adults</u> were living paycheck to paycheck in July, according to LendingClub.
- Bankrate issued its list of the 10 cheapest states to retire.
- According to a survey by Handshake, <u>almost 70% of college seniors</u> say their student loan debt will impact the jobs they consider.

HOUSING NEWS

- Pending home sales rose in July at their fastest pace since January.
- Mortgage rates ticked lower, but remained above 7% for the third straight week.
